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What is Dyslexia?

- A learning difference which affects the development of literacy and language skills. It has a range of characteristics which includes strengths in problem solving, empathy, creative and/or communication skills. Weaknesses can include phonological processing, rapid naming, working memory and processing speed which can affect the development of fluent reading and writing
- The development of these skills do not match other cognitive abilities
- Dyslexia tends to be resistant to conventional teaching and can be helped with specialist intervention, technology and support.

- promote continuing professional development in SpLD assessment
