When my teacher called me out, I stood there frozen, staring at the board...staring at her... staring at the floor. That was the beginning of my awareness that I was different"

"Frustrated, my teacher struck me so hard that my earring flew out of my ear. At three years old, I learned what shame felt like. Not because I was stubborn, but because I genuinely did not understand what was being taught."

"At nine years old, I was placed in Basic 1 on trial. For the first time in my life, a teacher taught me the alphabet in a way my brain could understand. Within a few weeks, I had moved from Basic 1 to Basic 2. My parents wept — this time, out of joy."

Excerpt 4 (Becoming a University Champion)

"From a child who could not write the alphabet, I went on to become Overall Best Graduating of a top ranked university in Africa. Every lecture hall I entered, I reminded myself: This is the same girl they called 'dull.' This is the same girl they said would never amount to anything.

And I made up my mind that no trace of shame would follow me into my future."

UNDERSTANDING DYSLEXIA: WHY THIS BOOK IS IMPORTANT

Dyslexia is a common learning disability that affects reading, writing, and spelling. It is neurological in origin and is not related to intelligence, effort, or vision.

Individuals with dyslexia often have strengths in areas like problem-solving, creativity, and big-picture thinking, yet they can struggle significantly with traditional literacy instruction when not given the right support.

In many Nigerian communities, children with dyslexia are frequently mislabeled as "Olodo" — a derogatory tag implying they are slow learners. This misunderstanding, coupled with a general lack of awareness of dyslexia and tailored support in schools, leads to devastating outcomes:

Research indicates that students with learning disabilities, including dyslexia, are nearly three times more likely to drop out of school than their peers.

For many, the constant struggle and stigma become too heavy to bear, leading them to abandon their education and their dreams entirely.

Countless young people are left behind, not due to a lack of potential, but due to an absence of appropriate strategies, understanding, and encouragement.

- Dyslexia is everywhere: statistically, 1 in every 5 learners in every classroom has dyslexia.
- ☐ Over 20-30 percent of the global population have dyslexia.
- ☐ In Nigeria, over 32 million people, including school children, are

affected, with a 30-50% chance of the condition being genetically inherited.

This is an urgent call to action. Every day without proper support is a day a child with dyslexia is pushed closer to giving up. We must act now to save these brilliant minds within our schools. We must replace labels with understanding, replace frustration with strategy, and replace isolation with inclusion.

The Dyslexic Genius Book is more than a personal success story of dyslexia — it is a vital tool for this crucial mission. It provides the insight, hope, and practical guidance needed to transform the educational journey for a child with dyslexia.
